## GENERAL INFORMATION

Enclosed is the technical information for both the Sask Skate Invitational Competition and the *Sask Open Singles Competition*. Competitors in the Sask Skate Invitational Competition are invited to compete by their Home Section. Each Section will develop their own selection criteria for inviting skaters to compete in the Sask Skate Invitational Competition and will notify those skaters selected. Some skaters may not be notified by their Section in regards to their entry into the Invitational competition by the entry deadline date. If skaters are unsure which competition to enter by the entry deadline date, they should enter the Invitational competition. Those not selected by their Section will automatically be entered into the corresponding events in the *Sask Open Singles Competition*. All Ice Dance, Men and the Senior Ladies events are only offered in the Sask Skate Invitational competition. Skaters do not need an invitation for these events. *The Sask Open Singles Competition* is open to all skaters not entered in the Sask Skate Invitational Competition.

### 1. **RULES & ELIGIBILITY**

The Sask Skate/Open Competition will be conducted in accordance with the regulations as outlined by Skate Canada and is sanctioned by Skate Canada. Competitors must be eligible skaters as defined in Section 2100 of the Skate Canada Rule Book and be registered skaters in good standing with Skate Canada affiliated clubs.

### 2. **TECHNICAL NOTES**

- a) Any amendments or technical changes made by the International Skating Union or Skate Canada will be in effect for this competition.
- b) Competitors in the *Sask Open Singles Competition* may skate up one level.

### 3. **CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES**

Entries must be received by **12:00 NOON ON THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, 2010**. In the event of a postal disruption it is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure that their entry is received by the closing date, at their own expense. Test qualifications are as of **September 9, 2010**. Age qualifications are as of July 1, 2010. For those events where proof of age is necessary, applicants should be able to provide their birth certificate (or other proof) if requested at registration.

If only one entry is received for an event, the Host committee will inform the competitor and the entry fee will be refunded and event cancelled.

Entry forms must be signed by the skater's professional coach. Faxed entries will only be accepted when accompanied by credit card payment. Completed entry forms and fees are to be returned to:

### 5. **PRACTICE ICE**

There will be no practice sessions available for STARSkate Elements. All other events will be provided a practice session prior to each segment of the event. For Special Olympic events, the practice session will be scheduled with the event time. The cost of practice ice is included in the entry fee.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

### 6. **REFUNDS**

No refunds will be issued for any reason after the closing date of entries. All refunds prior to the deadline will be subject to a \$20 processing charge.

### 7. **SYSTEM OF MARKING**

Competitive events will be judged using the CPC scoring system. STARSkate and Special Olympic events will be judged using the 6.0 system. Closed marking will be in effect.

### 8. **FLIGHT SYSTEM**

In the Sask Open Competition, if the number of competitors in an event warrants it, a flight system will be used. Flights will be determined by skaters' age for STARSkate events and by random draw for Competitive events. All Competitive events will have a combined result. There will be no final rounds for any event. In the Sask Skate Invitational Competition, there are no flights and all events are limited to a maximum of 24 skaters.

### 9. **REGISTRATION**

Skaters must register at least 1 hour before their first practice session or at least 2 hours prior to the scheduled start time of their first event but no earlier than 45 minutes before the first event of the day. Music and Planned Program Content forms must be handed in at time of registration.

### 10. **MUSIC REQUIREMENTS**

Music will only be accepted in CD format. All music must be handed in at the time of registration. Only one program shall be recorded on each CD. Two CDs must be provided for each program. One shall be for competition (marked 'Master') and one as a back-up (marked 'Copy'). CDs must be marked with the competitor's name, home club, event, and total music time (not skating time). CDs should be enclosed in their integral container, also marked accordingly. **Please ensure all CDs are in excellent playing condition.**

Competitors are responsible for the recovery of their music at the completion of their event. The Host Committee will accept no responsibility against damage, but will take every precaution to safeguard each CD that is registered.

### 11. **SCHEDULE OF EVENTS (TENTATIVE)**

### 12. **ACCIDENTS**

Skate Canada, Skate Canada – Saskatchewan, and the Host Committee undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skater. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in this competition, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with the conduct and management of the competitions. An agreement must also be deemed to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, Skate Canada, Skate Canada – Saskatchewan, the Host Committee, and their officers. Entries shall be accepted only in accordance with these conditions.

### 13. **AWARDS**

Medals will be awarded for the top three placements in each event of the competition.

### 14. **ADMISSION FEE**

There will be no admission fee for this competition.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

### **15. COACH ACCREDITATION**

All coaches must be minimally certified NCCP Level 1, and carry their Photo ID card indicating current membership within the Association and a valid First Aid certificate in order to gain entrance to areas at ice level. There may be a specified coaching area at ice level. Only skaters and accredited coaches will be permitted in this area.

**Competitive Singles Test equivalencies in the STARSkate events:** As regulation 4000(E)(3.1) states, skaters passing Free Skate tests in the competitive test system are granted equivalencies for STARSkate free skate tests as follows:

Juvenile Competitive Singles Test = Senior Bronze Free Skate Test  
Pre-Novice Competitive Singles Test = Junior Silver Free Skate Test  
Novice Competitive Singles Test = Senior Silver Free Skate Test  
Junior Competitive Singles Test = Gold Free Skate Test

Skaters who have passed any competitive singles tests must enter the STARSkate Event at the level corresponding to their highest STARSkate test passed or at the level which they received the equivalency in the STARSkate Program, whichever is higher.

#### **Preliminary Free Skate (Men and Ladies)**

1. Test: May have passed complete Preliminary Free Skate but not the complete Jr. Bronze Free Skate test
2. Event: Free Program 2min (+/- 10 sec)

#### **Junior Bronze Free Skate (Men and Ladies)**

1. Test: May have passed complete Jr. Bronze Free Skate but not the complete Sr. Bronze Free Skate test
2. Event: Free Program 2min 30sec (+/- 10 sec)

#### **Senior Bronze Free Skate (Men and Ladies)**

1. Test: May have passed complete Sr. Bronze Free Skate but not the complete Jr. Silver Free Skate test
2. Event: Free Program 3min (+/- 10 sec)

#### **Junior Silver Free Skate (Men and Ladies)**

1. Test: May have passed complete Jr. Silver Free Skate but not the complete Sr. Silver Free Skate test
2. Event: Free Program 3min 30sec (+/- 10 sec)

#### **Senior Silver Free Skate (Men and Ladies)**

1. Test: May have passed complete Sr. Silver Free Skate but not the complete Gold Free Skate test
2. Event: Free Program 3min 30sec (+/- 10 sec)

1. Test: May have passed complete Gold Free Skate

### STARSkate Elements

#### **ELIGIBILITY FOR ELEMENT EVENTS IS THE SAME AS FOR THE STARSKATE FREE SKATE EVENTS**

Program to be skated without music. The program shall have an opening and closing movement. Elements may be skated in any order. Connecting steps are permitted to link the elements. Additional or repeated elements that have failed are not permitted. Rotational movements of more than 1 full rotation shall be considered extra elements. Small jumps of not more than half a turn may be included in the step sequences.

#### **Preliminary Elements (Men and Ladies)**

Program length not to exceed 1min 15sec. Only half ice to be used  
Elements to be performed:

1. Camel Spin (min. 2 rotations in basic position. Change of foot optional. No variation of basic position)
2. Sit Spin (min. 2 rotations in basic position. Change of foot optional. No variation of basic position)
3. Any Single Jump
4. Jump Combination – single Lutz jump followed by a single toe-loop or a single loop
5. Forward Spiral on each foot (Edges optional. No variations of basic position. Min. 3sec hold)

## SASK OPEN EVENTS

### Junior Bronze Elements (Men and Ladies)

Program length not to exceed 2min. Full ice to be used

Elements to be performed:

1. One Position Spin (min. 3 rotations in basic position. May commence with a flying entry)
2. Combination Spin (only 2 positions with min. 2 rotations in each position. Change of foot optional)
3. Single Axel
4. Any Single or Double Jump (may not repeat Axel)
5. Jump Combination – 2 single jumps or 1 double and 1 single jump (Axel may be repeated)
6. Straight Line Step Sequence

### Senior Bronze Elements (Men and Ladies)

Program length not to exceed 2min. Full ice to be used

Elements to be performed:

1. Flying Camel Spin (min. 3 rotations in basic position)
2. Combination Spin (min. 2 positions with min. 2 rotations in each position. Only 1 change of foot)
3. Single Axel
4. Any Double Jump
5. Jump Combination – 1 single and 1 double jump or 2 double jumps (Solo jumps may not be repeated)
6. Step Sequence (Straight Line, Circular or Serpentine)

### Junior Silver Elements (Men and Ladies)

Program length not to exceed 2min. Full ice to be used

Elements to be performed:

1. Sit Spin with Change of Foot (min. 4 rotations on each foot)
2. Combination Spin (all 3 basic positions with min. 2 rotations in each position. Only 1 change of foot)
3. Single Axel
4. Any Double Jump
5. Jump Combination – 1 single and 1 double jump or 2 double jumps. Second jump **MUST** be double (Solo jumps may not be repeated)
6. Sequence of 3 different Field Moves

### Senior Silver Elements (Men and Ladies)

Program length not to exceed 2min. Full ice to be used

Elements to be performed:

1. Flying Camel/Back Sit Spin (min. 5 rotations in each position)
2. Combination Spin (all 3 basic positions with min. 2 rotations in each position. Only 1 change of foot)
3. Single Axel
4. Any Double Jump
5. Jump Combination – 2 double jumps (Solo jumps may not be repeated)
6. Sequence of 3 different Field Moves

### Gold Elements (Men and Ladies)

Program length not to exceed 2min. Full ice to be used

Elements to be performed:

1. Any Flying Spin (min. 6 rotations. Optional position)
2. Combination Spin (all 3 basic positions with min. 2 rotations in each position. Only 1 change of foot)
3. Single or Double Axel
4. Any Double Jump
5. Jump Combination – 2 double jumps (Solo jumps may not be repeated)
6. Sequence of 3 different Field Moves
