Skate Canada Manitoba is proud to present its Annual Achievement Awards Program. The Skate Canada Manitoba Achievement Awards Booklet describes in detail the structure and process of the individual awards.

Each year clubs are asked to nominate for these awards, individuals who have helped make their club successful. These awards will be presented at the Skate Canada Manitoba Annual Achievement Awards Ceremony at the Hotel where we are hosting our Annual General Meeting.

The Section Awards Committee reviews the applications and selects the most deserving nominee in each category. The more information the committee receives, the better they can assess your nominee. Supporting letters from Club members, family and other organizations with which your nominee is involved are helpful to the committee. Clubs submitting applications are encouraged to add any extra biographical information on separate sheets of paper.

Nominations may be submitted by any member of the Manitoba Section, Board of Directors or Club. Nominations for the coaching awards may be made by Skate Canada Coaching members.

The enclosed forms will help you get a head start on the nomination process. We have also included a page on the Award Nomination Process, a list of suggested guidelines, and a list of previous recipients, to assist you in gathering your nominee's profile.

Please ensure your forms are returned in legible form to avoid spelling errors on certificates and awards.

The Nomination Form(s) may be completed in the following manner:

- Candidate's name for each award must be printed clearly in **BOLD TYPE**
- Complete Nomination Form(s) and corner staple or paperclip.
- Photocopy Nomination Form(s), complete and submit
- Tear Nomination Form(s) out of booklet, complete and submit
- Nomination Form(s) may be emailed directly to Lois Kreutzer at skate.admin@sportmanitoba.ca

SKATE CANADA MANITOBA SUGGESTED GUIDELINES

TO: Club President or Awards Representative

- Read Awards Booklet thoroughly, CAREFULLY noting the criteria
- Make a note of all awards that apply to individuals within your club
- Call a meeting or at the next meeting, discuss potential candidates
- Settle on the specific awards and ONE candidate from your club per award
- Ensure that someone will coordinate the compiling of the information, or divide it up
- Ensure that the coordinator(s) are aware of some of the winning tips for preparing an Award Nomination
- Set a deadline to have all paperwork compiled
- Ensure that it is in the mail before the deadline (refer to awards booklet)

Winning tips:

- Consult **knowledgeable** people for accurate information concerning the candidate's endeavors, competitive records, other activities or areas of involvement within or outside of skating, philosophies, quotes or notable remarks - these people could be a mother, sister, husband, dear friend, etc.
- Select approx. 3 people who could write brief letters of commendation for the candidate (strive for diversity) e.g. school teacher, skating coach, 4-H leader, a skater they teach, a close relative, club executive member, etc.
- Ensure that they know exactly what kind of an award this is and what the criteria is – explain to them the kinds of things they should try to include, e.g. special qualities, deeds and other endeavors.
- Ensure that they are aware of the deadline to get this information back to you
- Compile the information received for each candidate and clip it to their specific nomination form
- Ensure information is filled in **accurately** and **legibly** on the forms in the spaces provided
- Write a brief cover letter from the club stressing why this individual is such a worthy candidate
- Make a copy for your files
- Mail or deliver the nominations by the deadline

Clearly indicate the candidate's name for each award in BOLD TYPE. When submitting a photograph with a nomination, please ensure that you have permission from the nominee to use and publish the photo.

SKATE CANADA MANITOBA AWARD NOMINATION PROCESS

This year there is only one Volunteer Award, as the Section Volunteer Award has now been combined with the Skater Canada Volunteer Award of Excellence. The criteria has been changed to state that ideally seven years of volunteer commitment would be required.

CanSkater of the Year

The purpose of the CanSkater of the Year Award is to recognize skaters who have shown enthusiasm and dedication to the CanSkate program throughout the skating season. Through their participation in the program, recipients of this award have demonstrated the talent and desire needed to find continued success on and off the ice.

The CanSkater of the Year Award is part of the CanSkate Champions Medal Program. Each club (within the Section) must establish a selection committee with a minimum of three people, including one NCCP professional CanSkate coach. The Selection Committee must submit the name of the club's "CanSkater of the Year" to the Section Awards committee, accompanied by a short paragraph explaining why the skater should be considered the "CanSkater of the Year."

Each Skate Canada Section will select the winner from their respective Section. Each Section must submit the winner's name and a short paragraph explaining why the skater should be chosen as the CanSkater of the Year to the Skate Canada National Office. Skate Canada representatives will determine which one of the 13 Section winners will be present at the Skate Canada Achievement Awards Gala.

The Section's selection for CanSkater of the Year will be recognized at the Skate Canada Manitoba Achievement Awards Ceremony.

Criteria:

- Each skater must be eight-years-of-age or under and currently enrolled in a CanSkate program;
- The skater demonstrates :
 - Self-confidence, determination and a positive attitude.
 - A natural ability/talent coupled with a passion for skating. These skaters will have the desire to continue and succeed in skating.
 - An eagerness to learn new skills and to improve.
 - An awareness of physical fitness. The skater pursues an active lifestyle off-ice, is involved in other sports gaining the physical literacy needed to enhance their on-ice skating skills and abilities.
 - An understanding of the rules of fair play and cooperation.
 - Is completely engaged in the fun and interactive on-ice environment and participates fully in all activities.

- A currently registered STARSkate athlete of any age who has passed at least one complete test certificate (ex: Junior Bronze Free Skate Test [Part 1: Elements + Part 2: Free Program], Junior Silver Dance Test [Foxtrot + Harris Tango + American Waltz + Rocker Foxtrot], etc.) in at least three of the disciplines within the Skate Canada STARSkate program (i.e. Skating Skills, Dance, Free Skating and Interpretive).

2012 Skate Canada Manitoba Achievement Awards Ian Carmichael Memorial Award

Ian Carmichael was a competitive skater in Manitoba who progressed into the judging ranks following his skating career. Dedicated to the sport he loved, he soon advanced to the Gold Test level and traveled the province, judging competitions and tests. A dentist by profession, Ian was always concerned with self improvement and continued to study and upgrade, both professionally and within the sport until just prior to his tragic death in 1992.

Ian made a most generous bequest to the Manitoba Section, Skate Canada. The Board of Directors recommended that a monetary Award be made annually using the interest from this money.

The recipient should be an individual who is showing commitment and dedication, both to the sport of figure skating and to further education.

CRITERIA:

The Recipient should be:

- 1) A skater or ex-skater in any discipline between the ages of 16 and 25 years, who has achieved at least their 2nd Figure, Junior Bronze Free, Junior Bronze Dance.
- 2) Is continuing in the sport as either a judge, data specialist or coach and has attained any of the following minimum levels:
 - a) Judge - Primary Evaluator and/or Novice Synchro
 - b) Data Specialist - Level 1
 - c) Coach - Level I (Theory & Technical)
- 3) Is currently attending and is seriously pursuing a post secondary education (at least 3 credits).
- 4) Has contributed significantly to the sport of figure skating in Manitoba for at least two years.

Nominations may come from any member of the Manitoba Section, Board of Directors or Skate Canada member clubs.

A recommendation from the Awards Committee is forwarded to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee will make a final decision and announce the recipient of the Award.
