**ELIGIBILITY:** Entries must be eligible skaters as defined in Section 2200 of the Skate Canada Rule book and be Associate Members of the association - Skate Canada Rule 5503.

**\*\*Skaters competing in Pre Novice Level or higher at the 2011 Bank of Montreal Sectional Figure Skating Championships are not eligible to enter. Skaters placing in the top 3 at a Skate Canada-Manitoba Regional Competition (or other Section equivalent) may only enter in Open Free skate events, and any other non-Free skate events.**

Skaters may compete in as many events as qualified by their test level as of Feb. 1, 2012. Skaters may skate up, but may compete in only one level of a given event.

## **Coaches**

Coaches must be NCCP Level 1 certified, hold a valid First Aid Certificate, and must be registered professional coaching members in good standing with Skate Canada. Coaches must carry a valid Coach Photo ID card to be permitted to coach at any event. Coaches failing to provide the proper Coach Photo ID will be charged admission to the event and will not be permitted into any restricted or designated Coaching areas.

**ENTRIES: IF MAILED - Must be postmarked no later than FEBRUARY 14th, 2012.** Please make cheques or money orders payable to **Stony Mountain On Ice** (Post dated cheques will not be accepted) The entry fee of \$40.00 (plus \$10 if mailed or Faxed) for the first single event, \$15.00 for each additional event and \$40.00 (plus \$10 if mailed or Faxed) per team must accompany the completed application. All refunds will require a written medical note from a doctor dated no later than March 31, 2012.

**REGISTRATION:** The registration desk will be open **one hour** prior to the start of the first event each day and will remain open throughout the competition. ALL Skaters must register one hour prior to EACH of their scheduled events in order that they may be accounted for. Failure to register prior to EACH event may result in disqualification for that event.

**\*\*All Events are flighted according to age. Marking to be closed (top three placing to be posted). Individual and complete Protocols will not be for sale.** Results to be calculated with one by one (OBO) method of calculation. Schedules will be mailed out prior to the competition and will be available online at the Skate Manitoba Website.

**Online Registration Instruction using the Karelo System:**

To register online, go to <http://www.skatestony.ca> and select the Stony On Ice 2012 Event. Please print the steps below so you have a ready reference to help you with the online registration process.

**Using Karelo for the first time:**

If you have never used Karelo.com before:

- 1: Select "Do you want a Login?" on the left side of the screen, or [click here to go to the Login Registration screen](#)
- 2: Select a Login name
- 3: Enter the skaters contact information

When entering the contact information, please use the **skater's name, and not the parent's name**. Skate Canada numbers must be entered as per your skaters card (i.e. 10 digits including all zeros). This is a very short and simple step that will enable you to avoid the hassle of re-entering your information for each event registration. Your contact information is never shared with third parties. Please review [Karelo's Privacy Policy](#) for more details.

**Entering your registration:**

- 1: Login. Select the Event that you want to register from the Event list
- 2: Enter your registration number
- 3: Enter your credit card/debit information (Visa or MasterCard or Debit)

### \*\*\*MUSIC\*\*\*

CD's will be the only format used at Manitoba Competitions for the 2012 season

**REGISTRATION OF MUSIC: Music must be turned in at the time of registration. CD's and their cases must have the competitor's name and event clearly printed on them. The music information as required on the Entry Form must be completed in detail (as applicable).**

**All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies.**

**Competitors who have music composed especially for their program either wholly or in part, shall be responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music on radio or television or appropriate clearance from the performing rights society.**

**MUSIC REQUIREMENTS: Each entry must provide 2 CD's for the Competition upon registration. One for competition (marked "Master") and one for back-up (marked "copy"). It is recommended that a backup CD be carried by the skater. Please place phonetic spelling of first and last name on the CD cases to aid the announcer with pronunciation.**

#### Standard Specifications

1. Only one (1) program (using one track only) shall be recorded on each CD.
2. Music shall be recorded onto the CD so that it starts within no less than 0.5 seconds and not more than 2 seconds after the play button is pressed on the CD player.
3. CD recording level shall be normal consistent listening level. Music shall be recorded at equal levels on both left and right channels in stereo.

Each Compact Disc shall:

- ❖ Be on a standard CR-R and enclosed in a single transparent plastic case. Do not use CD-RW
- ❖ Have the music recorded in Compact disc audio (CDA) or WAV format. (Not MP3, iTunes or DVD format)
- ❖ Be in good clean playable condition.

#### Labeling

**Skater's name, category name, total music time (not skating time) and Home Club shall be clearly printed on:**

1. Label on the CD case back insert only. The CD must be visible in front of case.
2. Identify CD by writing on the front of the CD using a fine or medium Sharpie type marker. Do not use a ballpoint pen.
3. Do not apply stick on labels to the CD
4. Label disc with Master or Backup copy clearly on the front.

#### \*\*\*CAMERA POLICY\*\*\*

**Flash photography is not permitted. Skate Canada Manitoba restricts the use of cameras and video equipment during Skate Canada sanctioned events out of respect for the safety and to protect the privacy of competing athletes.**

**Spectators are permitted to use cameras at the event for personal use only and are subject to the following conditions. Anyone who does not abide by these rules risks having their camera confiscated by authorized personnel.**

- No flash photography is allowed
- Camera lens must not be larger than 200mm in order to avoid obstructing the view of other spectators
- Any resale of photography or posting photos on websites is strictly prohibited
- Video camera's can only be used by the parent(s) of their own skater during their performance

**Coaches are only permitted to video tape their own skater from the boards during that skater's practice or performance. Coaches cannot video tape from the spectator area**

**\*\*\*INTERPRETIVE EVENT\*\*\*****MUSIC: SKATERS CHOICE**

The Interpretive program consists of a variety of skating moves selected for their value in enhancing the skater's interpretation of the music rather than for their technical difficulty. Jumps may be included, but credit will not be given for their technical difficulty. Credit for jumps and spins is based solely on the chosen theme, not merely a collection of pleasing or spectacular moves assembled to entertain an audience (exhibition/show program).

Although creative movement usually has a theme as a starting point, each movement need not be part of a coherent "story line". Movement expresses in aesthetic form the drives, desires, and reactions of alive human beings. It does not involve animals, fairies, ghosts or toys come to life, except as they might exist in the mind of the skater.

While many programs will, undoubtedly, reflect known themes from past ballet, opera, operetta or musical productions of the stage or screen, skaters should be encouraged to move beyond these to explore more original and personal concepts. Skaters choosing an unknown theme shall be rewarded. Programs might explore designs in abstract movement suggested by selected sound patterns, moods, or concepts.

Skaters **MUST** submit, prior to competition, a brief statement of the chosen theme. It is to be no more than 70 characters in length.

    - (i) **TEST:** Must not have passed any Skate Canada interpretive skating test
    - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2:00 to 3:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
  
  - (b) **INTRODUCTORY INTERPRETIVE**
    - (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the Introductory interpretive test but no higher Interpretive test
    - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2:00 to 3:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
  
  - (c) **BRONZE INTERPRETIVE**
    - (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the Bronze interpretive test but no higher Interpretive test
    - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2:00 to 3:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
  
  - (d) **SILVER INTERPRETIVE**
    - (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the Silver interpretive test but no higher Interpretive test
    - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2:00 to 3:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
  
  - (e) **GOLD INTERPRETIVE**
    - (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the Gold interpretive test
    - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2:00 to 3:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
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**SINGLES FREESKATE** (*Tests passed are complete Free skate tests*)

**FREESKATE:**

*Skaters who did not place in the top 3 at a Skate Canada-Manitoba Regional Competition (or other Section equivalent)*

**OPEN FREESKATE:**

*Skaters who placed in the top 3 at a Skate Canada-Manitoba Regional Competition (or other Section equivalent)*

PRE-ENTRY LEVEL and ENTRY LEVEL-Jumps must be no higher than a loop jump (this means no flip, lutz, or axel)

*Skaters competing in ADULT events must be at least 18 years of age as of February 01, 2012.*

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**IMPROV EVENT**

**MUSIC SELECTED AND PROVIDED BY COMPETITION COMMITTEE.**

**Eligibility by test level is the SAME as Free skating event.**

**Appropriate skating attire to be worn, no costumes.**

The accent for this event is on fun rather than technique. The events are judged for interpretation of the music. Skaters competing will hear the music 3 times prior to competing. Skaters are not allowed to watch the skaters in their event prior to competing. No coaching is allowed for this event.

**PRE-PRELIMINARY / PRELIMINARY / JUNIOR BRONZE / SENIOR BRONZE - 1 Minute**  
**INTERMEDIATE                      1.5 minutes**

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## **SPIN EVENT**

- Spins shall be skated in a simple program with no extra or repeated elements. Connecting moves may include short sequences of footwork such as threes, brackets, rockers, etc. and/or spirals, spread eagles, Ina Bauers. Connecting moves are for the sole purpose of maneuvering between spins and will not be judged.
- All levels will use half of the ice surface.
- Skating time for all levels will be 1.5 minutes.
- No music allowed.
- Eligibility is the same as for free skating events.
- All events could be mixed gender

### **(a) PRE-PRELIMINARY SPINS**

- Forward Upright Spin (minimum of 3 revolutions)
- Sit spin (minimum of 3 revolutions)
- Back upright spin (minimum of 3 revolutions)

### **(b) PRELIMINARY SPINS**

- Sit spin (minimum of 3 rotations)
- Camel spin (minimum of 3 rotations)
- Combination spin (Change of foot optional. Must include all three positions)

### **(c) JUNIOR BRONZE SPINS**

- Flying spin (one position with no change of foot. Minimum 4 revolutions)
- Combination spin (change of foot mandatory. Must include all three positions. Minimum of 4 revolutions on each foot)
- One position spin(Change of foot optional, no flying entry. Minimum of 4 revolutions)

### **(d) SENIOR BRONZE SPINS**

- Flying spin (one position with no change of foot. Minimum of 5 revolutions)
- Combination spin (change of foot mandatory. Must include all three positions. Minimum of 5 revolutions on each foot)
- One position spin (Minimum of 5 revolutions, change of foot optional)

### **(e) JUNIOR SILVER SPINS**

- Flying spin (one position with no change of foot. Minimum of 6 revolutions)
- Combination spin (change of foot mandatory. Must include all three positions. Minimum of 6 revolutions on each foot)
- One position spin (Minimum of 6 revolutions, change of foot optional)

### **(f) GOLD / SENIOR SILVER SPINS (COMBINED EVENT)**

- Flying spin (one position with no change of foot. Minimum of 6 revolutions)
- Combination spin (change of foot mandatory. Must include all three positions. Minimum of 6 revolutions on each foot)
- One position spin (Minimum of 6 revolutions, change of foot optional)
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## **COMPULSORY ELEMENTS/SHORT PROGRAMS**

### **Components of a compulsory short program:**

- A program consisting of required elements
- Programs are to be performed with music
- Full ice surface
- Elements may be skated in any order using connecting steps, strong edges and flow
- Deductions will be taken for any added or repeated elements
- All events could be mixed gender

#### (a) JUNIOR SILVER, SENIOR SILVER & GOLD SHORT PROGRAM

**Skating time: 2 minutes & 30 seconds – maximum.**

#### **Follows Novice Short Program Requirements**

1. Single or Double Axel jump
  2. One double jump immediately preceded by connecting steps and/or other comparable free skating movements or triple jump (connecting steps not required). Double axel may not be repeated
  3. Jump combination – two double jumps or one double jump and one triple jump or two triple jumps\*
    - \*The jump combination may consist of the same jump or another double or triple jump. The jumps included must be different than the solo jump.
  4. **Women - Layback or sideways leaning spin (minimum of 6 revolutions) Men – Sit or camel spin with change of foot (min 5 revolutions on each foot, no flying entry)**
  5. Combination spin (minimum of 5 revolutions on each foot – 1 change of foot allowed (minimum of 2 basic positions))
- \*No flying entry on any spin**
6. Step Sequence (maximum of one step sequence – any pattern)

#### (a) SENIOR BRONZE SHORT PROGRAM

Skating time: 2 minutes & 30 seconds – maximum.

Follows Pre-Novice Short Program Requirements

1. Single or Double Axel jump
  2. Any double or triple jump
  3. Jump combination (two double jumps or one double and one triple jump)
- Note: The 2A may be repeated, but if it is repeated one must be in combination.  
 Note: Other than the 2A, no jump can be repeated unless as the first and second jump in the combination
- \*\* Only one triple jump may be included in the program.
4. **Women - Layback or sideways leaning spin (minimum of 5 revolutions) Men – Camel spin with only one change of foot (min. 4 revolutions on each foot)**
  5. Combination spin (minimum of 4 revolutions on each foot – 1 change of foot allowed minimum of 2 basic positions)
- \*No flying entry on any spin**
6. Step Sequence (maximum one step sequence – any pattern)

## COMPULSORY ELEMENTS

Junior Bronze and Preliminary will use full ice.

Entry and Pre-Preliminary will use ½ ice surface.

No music will be used.

Eligibility for Events is the same as for Free Skating Events.

The program consists of required elements and may be skated in any order.

Programs must have an opening and ending pose.

Connecting steps are permitted to link elements.

Deductions will be taken for any added or repeated elements.

(a) **JUNIOR BRONZE ELEMENT PROGRAM (Skating time 1:30 minutes - maximum)**

1. Single Axel jump
2. Double Salchow jump
3. Single Flip/single Toe Loop jump combination
4. Change combination spin (Minimum 2 rotations in each position)
5. Flying camel or flying sit spin (minimum of 3 rotations)

(b) **PRELIMINARY ELEMENT PROGRAM (Skating time 1:15 minute - maximum)**

1. Single Flip Jump
2. Single Lutz Jump
3. Single Loop/Single Loop Combination
4. Forward camel spin (minimum of 3 revolutions)
5. Change sit spin (minimum of 2 rotations on each foot)

(c) **PRE-PRELIMINARY ELEMENTS PROGRAM (Skating time 1:15 minute - maximum)**

1. Single Loop jump
2. Single Flip jump
3. Single Salchow/single Toe Loop jump combination
4. Sit spin (minimum of 2 revolutions)
5. Change Upright spin (minimum of 2 rotations on each foot)

(d) **ENTRY ELEMENT PROGRAM (Skating time 1:15 minute – maximum)**

Must not have passed any portion of the Preliminary Free Skate test or any Skating Skills test

1. Waltz jump
2. Single Toe Loop jump
3. Single Salchow jump
4. 1 Foot Upright spin (minimum of 2 rotations)
5. 1 Foot Backspin (minimum of 2 rotations)

(e) **PRE-ENTRY LEVEL (Skating time 1:00 minute – maximum)**

1. Waltz Jump
  2. Bunny Hop
  3. Forward One Foot Spin (minimum of 2 revolutions)
  4. Forward Spiral (foot & edge optional (inside or outside), no blade hold)
  5. Forward Drag
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## **MANEUVER TEAM EVENT**

**ENTRY FEE: \$40.00**

Each team will consist of four skaters and may be mixed male and female. The team **MUST** skate at the highest level of Freeskate achieved by any member of the team. Each team member will execute one element and will have only one chance to execute it. A skater may skate on only ONE team. No alternates permitted. If a skater is unable to compete due to illness or injury, another team member may skate the element with proper notice to the referee of the event.

**Eligibility by test levels is the same as for FREE SKATE EVENTS.**

**During the first minute of warm up for the event skaters will be allowed stroking only, NO JUMPS OR SPINS will be allowed.** The announcer will then instruct teams individual elements to warm up.
